Our Social Impact Report 2025

2025 has been another busy year for the team at Waste Not Want Not. **Our achievements** include:

- Visiting **834 properties** to collect donated good quality household furniture and white goods, thus diverting approximately **69 metric tonnes from landfill**.
- Supplied affordable goods to **3207 individuals** on low income, helping them to avoid the temptation to take on expensive debt.
- Secured **£67,000 in grants** for our flagship programme **Fresh Start**. We supported **104 individuals** (many with children) who are rebuilding their lives after suffering from domestic abuse, being homeless or fleeing from war torn countries.
- Provided volunteering, training, and work experience opportunities to **13 members of our local community**, helping them to develop new skills, confidence, and self- esteem.
- **Won** the Reuse Network **“Reuse Organisation of the year 2025 South of England”** award.
